- Doctor name or ID number
- NDC number (drug number)
- Name of drug and strength
- Quantity and days' supply
- Prescription number (Rx number)
- DAW (Dispense As Written)
- Amount paid

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PHARMACY INFORMATION (For Compound Prescriptions ONLY)

- List the VALID 11-digit NDC number for EACH ingredient used for the compound prescription.
- For each NDC number, indicate the "metric quantity" expressed in the number of tablets, grams, milliliters, creams, ointments, injectables, etc.
- For each NDC number, indicate cost per ingredient.
- Indicate the TOTAL charge (dollar amount) paid by the patient.
